ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS (AOC)

The Administrative Office of the Courts exists to enable the courts of New Mexico to accomplish their mission through:

- Ensuring that the courts have adequate, equitably distributed resources.
- Ensuring that the courts have and use current technology.
- Providing a fair and equitable statewide human resources system.
- Developing and implementing improved court processes and supporting courts in their use.
- Collecting and providing information on and for the courts.
- Managing and accounting for the collection of revenue.
- Ensuring sound financial, budgeting and procurement practices in the management of court resources.
- Maintaining liaison with the legislative and executive branches of state government.

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

Oversees the New Mexico Judicial Branch public relations and communications functions, both internal and external, for the judiciary. Supervision is received from the AOC Director and Supreme Court Chief Justice.

EXAMPLES OF JOB DUTIES

- **The AOC Chief Communications Officer** leads the judiciary's team that plans, develops, coordinates and implements a comprehensive program to enhance internal and external communication of the Judicial Branch's strategies, programs, policies and initiatives, including news media relations, public outreach and public education training for staff and Judges.
- Manages the AOC Communications Division leading the development of communication strategies within the judiciary, and provides guidance and direction for the public information team. Responsible for the recruitment and selection of division employees including the oversight of AOC Communications Office interns when applicable.
- Develops tools and provides skills to improve communications plans.
- Leads the collaboration with a wide range of individuals in the development and implementation of plans for effectively sharing information with the general public, legal community and the Legislative and Executive branches of government.
- Establishes and maintains positive, effective operating relationships with a variety of internal and external stakeholders including media representatives, public officials and

governmental agency representatives, businesses, trade associations, nonprofit organizations, and the public.

- Leads the development of judiciary communications including press releases, speeches, talking points, newsletters, social media content, memos, emails, fact sheets, and related internal and external communications work.
- Serves as the communications lead for the Supreme Court, Administrative Office of the Courts and other Judicial Branch entities or agencies; responds to and reviews responses to media inquiries by gathering information and referring the media to the appropriate resources.
- Completes special assignments in support of the New Mexico Judicial Branch.
- Plans, researches, prepares and disseminates public information, news releases, videos, public service announcements, and promotional and educational materials.
- Oversees the management of judiciary social media accounts, develops standards for and manages the graphic and video content for use on social media or any outlet used by the Judiciary.
- Represents the Administrative Office of the Courts and the New Mexico Supreme Court.
- Develops and makes presentations in a variety of settings including public meetings, legislative meetings, classrooms, and community events, and collaborates with court administrators, judges and judicial committees to determine public education and outreach activities. Coordinates and conducts community events. Works with the Bar Association to provide workshops and round table discussions for the media about courts statewide.
- Provides and directs strategies for responding to emergency incidents, serves as spokesperson to the press, public, and other public agency representatives, coordinates with local, state and federal Public Information Officers as needed, and serves as a representative or liaison to other public agencies.
- Assists with management and development of content on the New Mexico Judicial Branch website, and develops general information materials such as the Judiciary's Annual Report Assesses needs of and advocates for appropriate resources for programs within the Division.
- Assists in responding to public records requests and inquiries.
- Assists in the development, planning and communications of legislation and legislative activities by the judicial branch of government.
- Other duties as assigned.

COMPETENCIES/QUALIFICATIONS

The successful applicant should demonstrate advanced knowledge of the principles and practices of public and court administration, general local government functions, and the practices of the news media and public relations, exhibit excellent oral, written, technological and communication skills. The position requires demonstrated leadership skills, strong interpersonal skills, and organization. Ability to conceptualize, develop, and implement major media campaigns, marketing programs, and various special projects; manage social media accounts and website content; development of professional publishing such as reports, and newsletters and video productions. Ability to transform visionary ideas into effective practice.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education: Bachelor's degree from an accredited university in English, journalism, mass media communications, public relations, advertising, marketing, public administration or a related field.

Education Substitution: Four (4) years of directly related or relevant experience.

Experience: Ten (10) years of experience in public information, marketing, mass media, public relations, or a directly related field.

Experience Substitution: Additional relevant education at the Master's degree level may substitute for experience at a rate of thirty (30) semester hours equals one (1) year of experience.

WORK ENVIRONMENT AND PHYSICAL DEMANDS
